To ensure that all juniors, volunteers, and parents are aware of their responsibilities while participating in the game, the CFB Halifax Junior Executive has adopted the following Code of Ethics as an official supplement to the Rules of Curling:

CFB Halifax Junior Curlers' Code of Ethics

1. I will play the game with a spirit of good sportsmanship.
2. I will show my best manners and sportsmanship both on and off the ice. This includes not bragging about my win or being angry in defeat.
3. I will never knowingly break a rule, but if I do, I will tell the other team.
4. I will not be mean to my opponents, teammates or officials.
5. I will follow rules, always keeping in mind that the purpose of the rules is to make sure that the game is played fairly.
6. Fair Play results from showing everyone that my own manners and behaviours are a true reflection of who I am because I am proud to show my fair play skills to others.
7. Fair Play is how I show respect for teammates and opponents, whether they are winning or losing or if they make a great shot or miss.
8. Fair Play is how I show respect for officials, an acceptance of their decisions, and my dedication to working with them.
9. I believe by following these rules that I will be an asset to my team, my family, and our Junior Program.
10. I ask my teammates, coaches and parents to help me follow these rules at all times. If I break these rules, I will humbly accept any penalty awarded to me by my teammates, coaches or parents.
